# Seventh District Volunteer Rescue Squad Background

- Our mission is to provide the residents, commercial businesses, visitors, and surrounding areas of the Seventh District Volunteer Rescue Squad in Avenue, Maryland with the best pre-hospital Basic and Advanced Life Support services with the least possible delay and greatest possible efficiency.
- We run an average of 700-800 calls per year.
- We have 3 ambulances and 1 utility.
- We have approximately 60 squad members and 25 auxiliary members.
- Our skill levels range from CPR Certified to Paramedics.

# Seventh District Volunteer Rescue Squad Why we are here?

- We are requesting a tax increase from \$.011 to \$.030 on every \$100 of assessed value in order to cover increasing operating expenses, equipment costs, and to remodel the existing facility.
- We have not requested a tax increase in over 20 years. The only tax increase we requested increased the tax rate from the initial \$.009 to \$.011 on every \$100 of assessed value.
- The primary reason for this tax request is to fund a daytime duty crew. We are experiencing a lack of manpower during the day. This manpower shortage has led us to hiring a daytime duty crew. The paid duty crew is on shift Monday Thursday from 5:00AM to 15:00PM.
- We also need to add on to our existing facility. We last renovated 15 years ago but have identified the need to expand the footprint of our building.
- Some other operational expenses that continue to rise are for medical supplies, medications, ambulance maintenance, fuel bills, protective gear, information technology (IT) expenses, and utilities.
- Even though expenses have increased, we have been able to operate at the \$.011 tax rate for the past 20 years, through fundraising and community support.

# Seventh District Volunteer Rescue Squad Impact on Homeowners

- The Seventh District Volunteer Rescue Squad is currently receiving \$.011 for every \$100 of assessed property value and is requesting an increase to \$.030.
- Each property will be impacted differently.
- The actual amount of the increase will depend upon the value of the land and improvements as established by the State Department of Assessment and Taxation
- The average impact per household is projected to be \$35.72 per property.

## Seventh District Volunteer Rescue Squad Current Tax Revenue

- County Tax Code: Sec. 49-1. Emergency Services Tax
- How is the emergency services tax calculated?
  - The rescue tax is imposed at a rate of not more than three (3) cents on each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) of **assessable real property** other than operating real property of a public utility, and seven and one-half (7.5) cents on each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) of **assessable personal property and operating real property** of a public utility.
- How much emergency services tax revenue do we receive?
  - FY19 Actual \$97,291
  - FY18 Actual \$96,723
- Can we apply for additional increases to the tax rate?
  - No, we would be a the max amount allowed of (3) cents on each one hundred dollars (\$100).

# Seventh District Volunteer Rescue Squad Revenue from the Community

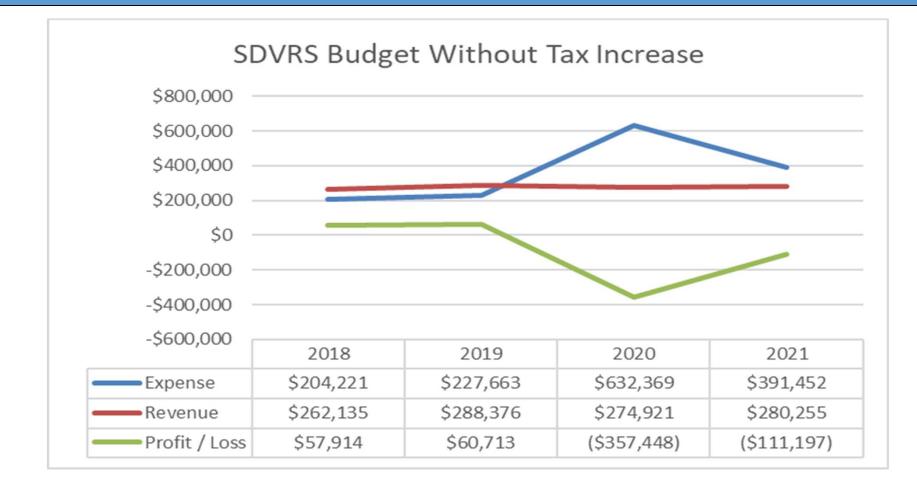
# Seventh District Volunteer Rescue Squad Why are our expenses increasing?

- Ambulance Maintenance has increased to more than \$6,500 per year.
- Fuel costs for the ambulances now exceed \$8,000 per year.
- Utility costs exceed \$17,000 per year.
- Medical Supplies and other patient care consumables that were once supplied by St. Mary's Hospital free-of-charge must now be purchased from outside vendors. The current cost of supplies exceeds \$6,000 per year not including medications.
- Training and continuing education costs for our members have increased.
- The cost of protective EMS gear is approximately \$1,200 per member.
- All reporting is now completed via the internet and use of computers. The cost to maintain computers/laptops and internet access continue to increase.

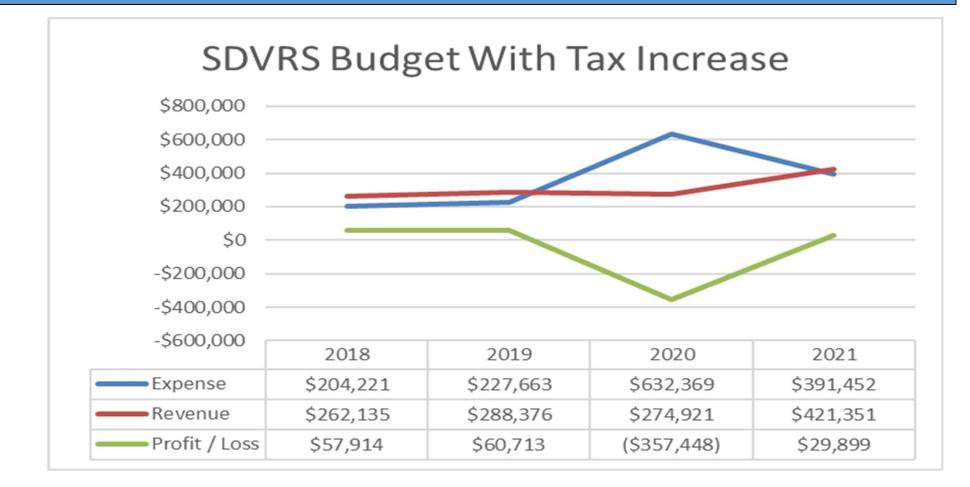
# Seventh District Volunteer Rescue Squad Why are our expenses increasing?

- Ambulance Replacement Costs
  - The cost of a new ambulance has increased from \$80,000 in 1999 to \$250,000 in 2020.
  - Our ambulances historically have a 15 year life span.
  - We are currently replacing our ambulances every 5 years.
  - This cost doesn't include the cost of equipment and supplies carried on the ambulance.
  - We usually use the county loan program to finance our ambulances. In 2020 we paid for the ambulance out of our savings.
- Building and Grounds Maintenance
  - We have outgrown our facility to the point that we need to add office space.
    - Our last remodel was @ 15 years ago.
  - We have two outbuildings and an annex building that add to our current utility bill.

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# Seventh District Volunteer Rescue Squad Summary and Conclusion

- We are requesting a tax increase from \$.011 to \$.030 on every \$100 of assessed value in order to cover increasing operating expenses, equipment costs, and to remodel the existing facility.
- The average impact per household is projected to be \$35.72 per property.
- The increased property tax will provide the Seventh District Volunteer Rescue Squad with an additional \$150,334 which will adequately fund the contract duty crew.
- Having a contract duty crew will increase the probability of receiving exemplary pre-hospital care with the least possible delay.
- Hopefully we will experience a surge in membership that will result in available EMTs during the day. This would allow us to cancel the contract and reduce operating expenses.
- The tax increase will allow the Seventh District Volunteer Rescue Squad to remain fiscally sound.
